




Before Coming to Japan

Required Japanese level







Virtual Campus Tour





Required Documents





The required documents vary for every enrollee. In the past, the following were some of the requirements for selffinanced international students when entering Japan:

- Certificate of Eligibility
- Admission Certificate
- Passport and Visa
- Graduation certificate*
- Notification of Contact Person

However, these documents, as well as those for students who are not selffinanced, the requirements may change especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. In knowing the full details of requirements for entering Japan, please follow instructions from university offices. *For those who submitted a Certificate of Expected Graduation at the time of application.

You can also effectively learn Japanese through courses offered at Doshisha!










Doshishamae literally means 'in front of Doshisha




You can visit sightseeing spots such as Kyoto Tower (left) and Uji River (right). Many more await you!


Daily Life
